TITLE X IN TEXAS



Every Body Texas is a non-profit organization dedicated to ensuring that every person in Texas can access safe, unbiased, high-quality sexual and reproductive healthcare.

As the statewide Title X Family Planning Program grantee for Texas, Every Body Texas funds a diverse network of more than 30 agencies—including federally qualified health centers (FQHCs), public health departments, hospital-based clinics, and free-standing family planning clinics—that serve 185,000 clients at more than 150 clinics throughout Texas.


Texas has the highest uninsured rate in the country. Just under a quarter of Texas women of reproductive age are uninsured.¹

During the 2023 legislative session, Texas increased funding to safety net sexual and reproductive healthcare programs by 22 percent. Bipartisan support for these programs and Medicaid for Pregnant Women is a great first step, but doesn't fully meet the reproductive healthcare needs of Texas women.


Strong funding for the Title X family planning program gives Texans access to high quality reproductive healthcare, regardless of income, status or hometown.

TITLE X SERVICES

Title X (ten) clinics provide low-cost or free confidential family planning services.




Contraceptive services, including talking about how birth control may fit with your future goals.



Basic fertility & infertility services, counseling on achieving pregnancy, preconception services, & pregnancy testing.



Testing & treatment for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) like chlamydia, gonorrhea and HIV and AIDS.



Related preventive health services such as breast and cervical cancer screening.

TEXAS FAMILY PLANNING HEALTH PROGRAMS

Beyond Title X, Texans can access sexual and reproductive care through a handful of statewide programs. These programs are intended to decrease rates of unintended pregnancy and improve health outcomes for both moms and babies.



HEALTHY TEXAS WOMEN (HTW)

Serves eligible low-income women ages 18-44 with preventive health services including contraceptive care.

2022: served 170,243 women*



FAMILY PLANNING PROGRAM (FPP)

Serves eligible low-income Texans with basic reproductive healthcare. Women can receive birth control, cancer screenings, and limited prenatal care benefits. **Men and women** can receive STI testing and treatment.

2022: served 113,833 Texans*



BREAST & CERVICAL CANCER SERVICES (BCCS)

Serves eligible low-income Texans with high-quality breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic services.

2022: served 30,422 Texans*



MEDICAID FOR PREGNANT WOMEN

In the 2023 Legislative Session, Texas extended Medicaid for Pregnant Women coverage from 60 days postpartum to 12 months. Coverage began March 1, 2024.

The number of reproductive-age women who need publicly funded family planning services in Texas is roughly the same as the total population of **Wyoming, Vermont, & Alaska combined.***
