


Title X


Title X (ten) clinics provide low-cost or free confidential family planning services.




Contraceptive services including talking about how birth control may fit with your future goals.



Basic fertility & infertility services, counseling on achieving pregnancy, preconception services, & pregnancy testing.



Testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections (STIs) like chlamydia, gonorrhea and HIV and AIDS.



Related preventive health services such as breast and cervical cancer screening.

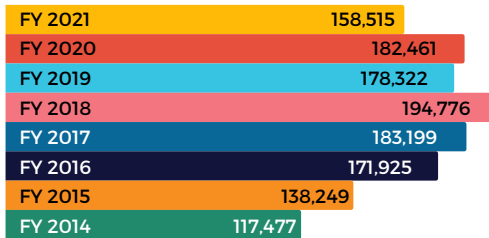
Every Body Texas supports providers of sexual and reproductive healthcare in Texas by administering Title X funding and delivering innovative training and technical assistance.

The federal Title X family planning program provides free and low-cost confidential family planning services for low income and uninsured people. Every Body Texas has been the statewide Title X administrator since 2013.

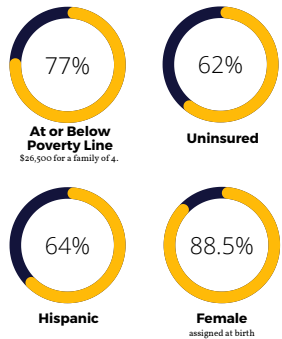
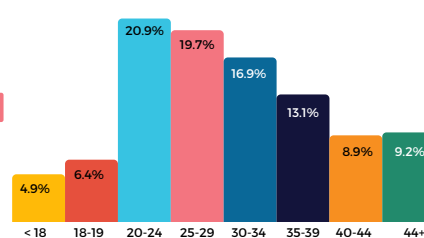
In addition to Title X, Every Body Texas runs innovative projects aimed at building the capacity and skills of social service healthcare providers to provide unbiased, person-centered services.

Contraceptive Access Project

In this project funded by the St. David's Foundation, Every Body Texas partnered with providers in the Central Texas area to provide training and technical assistance on administering long acting reversible contraceptives (LARC) and other contraceptives as well as funds to purchase LARC devices and financial incentives for other systems improvement.

No Wrong Door to Sexual and Reproductive Healthcare

By leveraging social service providers to improve linkages to sexual and reproductive healthcare, the No Wrong Door project trains social service providers to talk about reproductive life goals with clients. The three partner agencies build referral networks in the community to connect clients to sexual and reproductive healthcare they need.

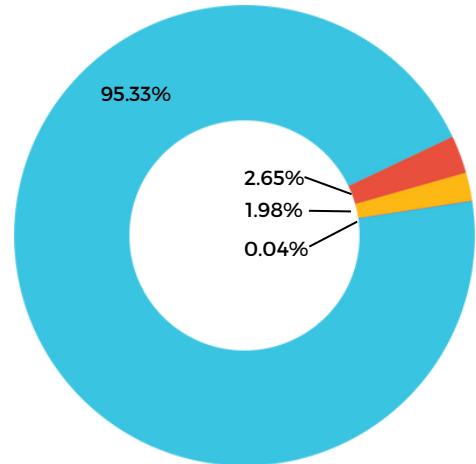

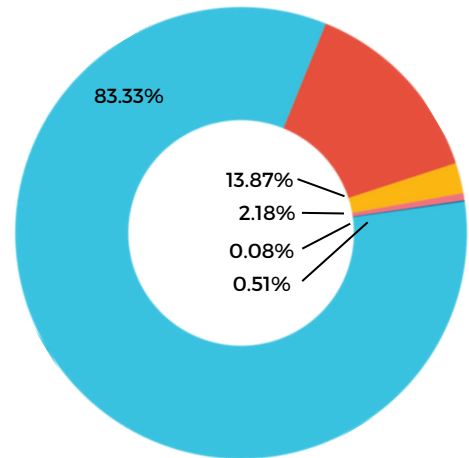

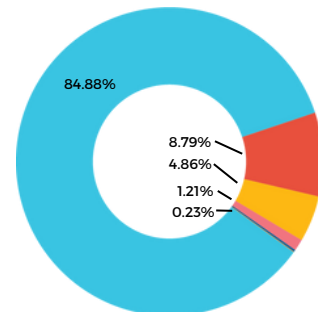
